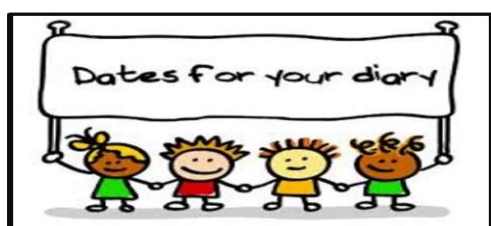

Post Covid restrictions we have managed to secure slots for Pyjama Drama and Diddi dance to join us again and be part of the extended curriculum we offer the children at Little Poppets. Pyjama Drama will join us in Little room on a Thursday from 9.30am and Didi Dance will join us 9.45am on a Wednesday in Big Room. This half term our children will be learning 'The Charleston' followed by 'Rock and Roll' in the run up to Easter. This service is free at the point of delivery for all of our Little Poppets. Please collect you children on time and if you know you need to have a chat with staff then allow time for this and arrive early. Our staff team are very good and will often stay late to cover but they also sometimes have plans and arrangements that mean they need to leave on time too and have to leave which can leave nursery out of ratio and puts children at risk and increased pressure on our lovely staff. Occasionally, things happen unexpectedly and if you let us know we are more than happy to help in these situations but day-to-day please arrive on time!

We are getting an increasing amount of children in Big Room bringing in **toys from home**. We are trying to discourage this because of the complications and confusion this causes many children who are often reluctant to share their special items with others which is obviously something encouraged in nursery. Special toys can also get lost which again causes upset and can be very time consuming as we search for these things. We are also trying too see this as a transitional learning opportunity in preparation for our older Poppets who will be moving onto school; However; we recognise that the children clearly want to show us things that they regard as special or important to them and so we

will be introducing a specific '**show and tell**' slot to our timetable where individual children are invited to bring something from home to show us and tell us about. Of course this doesn't always have to be a toy, it could be a photograph, a book or anything at all from home that inspires the children to open up, talk and share something special with us. Look out on DOJO for you child's 'show and tell' invitation and thank you for your support.

And Finally ... A couple of thoughts to share;

According to Anamika Mishra "Winter is the time for comfort, for good food and warmth, for the touch of a friendly hand and for a talk beside the fire: it is the time for home."
